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learn to read greek is a text and workbook for students beginning the study of ancient greek it is the companion volume to the authors learn to read latin published in 2004 like its latin predecessor it has a grammar based approach and is intended for students who have a serious interest in learning the language the text and workbook include carefully chosen vocabularies and extensive vocabulary notes clear and complete presentations of all necessary morphology and syntax large numbers of drills and drill sentences and abundant unabridged passages from a variety of greek authors and texts

this first year greek workbook is designed for use with any greek grammar provided that grammar lessons and vocabulary are learned in the sequence of the workbook exercises allow students to practice new material while reviewing what they have already learned each exercise is numbered to correspond with the translation exercise covering the same material though not all translations have corresponding exercises a graded reader allows students to begin reading large sections of continuous greek narrative as early as possible in a form tailored to the student s vocabulary and skill level vocabulary is introduced for each chapter with proper nouns low frequency words and irregular forms glossed the graded reader is based on the gospel of luke to acclimate students to texts that do not conform to english expectations of word order a key is provided for all exercises and translations to shift students expectations from performance based learning to an open and engaged learning environment

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
